INTRODUCTION – OVERVIEW OF THE INSTITUTION

Darjeeling Government College, as it stands today since 5th August, 1948, has traversed a long way in serving the community. This institution was established to educate the down pressed communities in such a remote area. The main purpose of educating the simple community has been to promote social, economic, educational and cultural progress of the people here in Darjeeling. The college has kept pace with the changing world and has been the pioneering spirit behind many innovations in the field of education thus acquiring a well-deserved reputation in academics, sports and co-curricular activities. The college is situated at the foothills of the eastern sub Himalayan region at an altitude of 2134 meters.

The full-time Government College teachers are appointed by the Government under the West Bengal Education Service (W.B.E.S.) and West Bengal Senior Education Service (W.B.S.E.S.) on the basis of recommendation of the Public Service Commission, West Bengal, following the eligibility criteria framed by the University Grants Commission (UGC). The college is totally under the administrative control of the Higher Education Department that frames all the policies and modalities regarding the functioning of the college. The District Magistrate acts as the President of the Governing Body.

The college boasts of running the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) study centre since 1986. One of the most important achievements of the college is the building up of a Central Library with a rich collection of more than 89000 books and good number of journals, including rare volumes of Tibetan, Nepali and Sanskrit works. The college is running 17 under graduate (UG) BA/B.Sc/B.Com programs and 4 Postgraduate (PG) M.A and M. Sc programs which are affiliated to the University of North Bengal. It was something exciting and rewarding, long-awaited by all the stakeholders of the institution after tasting the success of accreditation by National Assessment Accreditation Council (NAAC) in 2018 with B grade. Another milestone in the history of the college is the introduction of CBCS from the academic year 2015-2016. Overall, Darjeeling Government College has already earned fame for encouraging academic intercourse through organizing National and International seminars and workshops on specific disciplines and interdisciplinary subject.


